ACC-819 Volunteer Income Tax Assistance Training

Prerequisite: None Description: The Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) program is an initiative sponsored by the Internal Revenue Service. This course is intended to provide students with the opportunity to serve qualified individuals. VITA sites offer free tax help to people who need assistance in preparing their own tax returns, including: people who generally make \$57,000 or less; people with disabilities; and limited English-speaking taxpayers.
