

Ethnic Studies is unique as an educational experience that interrogates and redefines the individual and interrelated lives of African Americans/Black, Latina/o/x/#, Chicana/o/x/#, Asian American and Pacific Islander, and Indigenous peoples in the United States (BIPOC) from their own perspectives. Students will be introduced to interdisciplinary and multidisciplinary approaches that focus on systems of violence and oppression that BIPOC communities have historically experienced in the United States. Additionally, this course shall emphasize ideologies of resistance, persistence, liberation struggle, and radical knowledge production that both confront and transform oppressive conditions and create new possibilities for social change. Students will analyze work of key theorists of race, ethnicity, de-colonization, and futurity whose work and ideas have formed the basis and tenants of Ethnic Studies. Students will be in dialogue with the creative historical work of social, sovereignty, and abolitionist movements, cultural and artistic productions, legal and public policy activisms, indigenous and liberationist epistemologies, community and identity formation, and radical social and political thought.
